

Trevecca Nazarene University Graduate Counseling Program Outcomes Report 2020-2021

Trevecca Nazarene University is a private, not-for-profit institution with religious affiliation. The Graduate Counseling Program of Trevecca Nazarene University houses three CACREP-accredited programs:

- a master's program in Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MA degree in Clinical Mental Health Counseling)
- a master's program in Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy (MMFC/T degree in Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy)
- a doctoral program in Counselor Education and Supervision (Ph.D. Clinical Counseling: Teaching and Supervision degree)

Clinical Mental Health Counseling & Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy

Credit Hour Degree Requirements

Both the Master of Arts in Clinical Mental Health Counseling and the Master of Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy degrees require a minimum of **60** credit hours.

Graduates

For the fall 2020, spring 2021, summer 2021 semesters, the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program graduated a total of **20** students and the Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy program graduated a total of **39** students. In total, **59** students graduated with master's degrees from Trevecca Nazarene University's Graduate Counseling Program throughout the course of these three semesters. The breakdown of graduates per semester is as follows:

Completion Rate

Students entering the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program or the Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy program have six years, from the time of initial enrollment, to complete their program.

Statistics from the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program cohorts that started in the 2015-2016 academic year indicate that overall completion rate* of students who have attempted program completion is **85%**.

Statistics from the Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy program cohorts that started in the 2015-2016 academic year indicate that overall completion rate* of students who have attempted program completion is **81%**.

* Overall completion rate is an average of the part-time student completion rate and the full-time student completion rate.

Licensure Examination Pass Rate

Of known students and graduates in the CMHC program the pass rate for CMHC students taking the NCE (National Counseling Examination) was **86%** (upon first attempt).

Of known graduates from the MFC/T program who took the AMFTRB (Association of Marital and Family Therapy Regulatory Boards) Exam the pass rate was **100%** (upon first attempt).

Job Placement Rate

In a 2021 survey conducted by the Graduate Counseling Program, six-month job placement rates for students graduating from both the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program and the Marriage and Family Counseling/Therapy program in the fall 2020, spring 2021, and summer 2021 semesters were **90%**.

Trevecca Nazarene University's Ph.D. Clinical Counseling program participates in the Southern Association for Counselor Education and Supervision (SACES).

Credit Hour Degree Requirements

The Doctor of Philosophy in Clinical Counseling: Teaching and Supervision degree requires a minimum of **66** credit hours.

Graduates

For the fall 2020, spring 2021, and summer 2021 semesters, the Ph.D. Clinical Counseling: Teaching and Supervision program graduated a total of **8** students. The breakdown of graduates per semester is as follows:

Completion Rate

A student entering the Ph.D. Clinical Counseling: Teaching and Supervision program has six years, from the time of initial enrollment, to complete the program, which includes successful defense and acceptance of the student's dissertation.

Statistics from all cohorts eligible for graduation/program completion (determined by cohort start date, minimum time needed to complete the program, and attempted completion of the program) are as follows*:

- For the cohort beginning in 2007, the completion rate is **85.7%**

- For the cohort beginning in 2008, the completion rate is **75%**
- For the cohort beginning in 2009, the completion rate is **70%**
- For the cohort beginning in 2010, the completion rate is **64.7%**
- For the cohort beginning in 2011, the completion rate is **71.4%**
- For the cohort beginning in 2013, the completion rate is **71.4%**

Overall completion rate (combined completion rate), based upon the cohorts beginning 2007 through 2013 (cohorts with no students currently in process of program completion): **72.2%**

*All completion rates for the Ph.D. Clinical Counseling: Teaching and Supervision program are based upon student full-time enrollment status.

Job Placement Rate

In a 2021 survey conducted by the Graduate Counseling Program, six-month job placement rates for students graduating from the Ph.D. Clinical Counseling program in the summer 2020, fall 2020, and spring 2021 semesters were **100%**.
